H.M.S. "COPRA" - Pay, Drafting and Record Office.

Attention is drawn to A.F.O. 5941/43 paragraphs 4(a) and 10.

"4(a). Flotilla and Commanding Officers whose duty it is to pay the personnel under their command should carry out their instructions both diligently and accurately. They have full authority to pay as soon as due, and without previous reference to H.M.S. "COPRA" all pay and allowances of any kind covered by their instructions. Previous reference should, however, be made to H.M.S. "COPRA" should any considerable amount of back pay become payable. The system and the instructions will be simplified as much as possible."

"10. The postal address for all communications for H.M.S. "COPPA"

No other form of address is to be used on the envelope; correspondence is not to be addressed to the Commanding Officer or other officer, nor to H.M.S. "COPRA", except that correspondence on medical matters concerning medical history sheets is to be addressed to the Medical Officer. The address for signals is H.M.S. "COPRA"."

Ra ge Practices - Supervision.

"All range practices are to be carried out under supervision of an officer" (A.F.O. 5964/43 para. 3.)

The following A.F.O.'s refer to the handling of revolvers:-

A.F. O. 3376/41 - Fatal Accident caused by Accidental Dropping of a Loaded Revolver.

Another fatal accident has occurred, caused by a loaded revolver being accidentally dropped. The weapon was not cocked, but on falling the hammer struck a hard object, which forced it forward and fired the revolver.

- Further experiments have shown that revolvers of proved mechanical efficiency can be fired by a sharp blow on the hammer.
- 3. Except when reloading in action, revolvers are to be loaded in five chambers only, the sixth and empty chamber being placed opposite the hammer.
- 4. Administrative authorities and Commanding Officers are to ensure that all naval personnel, whether at present issued with revolvers or not, are so instructed - it being made clear that this precauti does not involve delay in opening fire, as the action of cocking the hammer or pulling the trigger in snap shooting automatically brings the loaded chamber in line with the striker. Also, the firer must bear in mind that he has five rounds only available for his immedia's dispute without reloading.

A. F. O. 2366/42. - ima. Arms - Care in Handling.

A fatal acc ent which recently occurred at a naval establishment was caused by a sentry armed with a loaded revolver leaving the hammer cocked when closing the revolver after inspecting it. The sentry in question had never fired a revolver before and had never had any struction in the use and safe handling of these weapons.

2. Attention is called to paragraph 3 of A.F.O. 1114/40; and in this connection it should be borne in mind that a revolver is a far more dangerous weapon (to his friends), in the hands of an inexperienced man, than a rifle, which is the normal weapon for a sentry.

A.F.O. 4259/42 - Revolvers - Fatal Accidents.

Several fatal accidents have recently occurred owing to carelessness in the handling of revolvers.

- 2. Contributory causes of these accidents have been:
 - (i) Inadequate supervision of the issue and return of revolvers and their loading and unloading.

(ii) Turning over the revolvers to reliefs in a casual manner.

(iii) Removing revolvers from holstons unpreservable.

- (iv) Removing revolvers from holsters unnecessarily while on watch.

 (iv) Pulling the trigger intentionally or through carelessness and thereby bringing a full chamber of the magaz djacent to
 - (v) Issuing revolvers to young and inexperienced tings.
- 3. Commanding Officers are to ensure that adequate orders are brought into force to prevent a recurrence of such accidents.

"As from 1st January, 1974, the only method of paying officers borne on the books of "COPRA" will be payment by local Accountant Officers on Emergency Pay Lists (Form S. 1039), which will be dealt with by Transfer of Cash procedure.

- 2. Separate Forms S. 1039 are to be used for paym ts to officers and C.O. ship's book numbers are always to be shown.
- 3. The date and amount of each advance are to be entered in the pay books and initialled by the Paying Officer.
- 4. Pay due for December will be dispose of according to present arrangements. There fter no cheques are of sent by "COPRA" to banks or to individual officers.
- officers wishing mon sent to their banks regularly must use the ordinary a lotment process.
- 6. Allotments must k 1 ted to the amount due in respect of full pay marriage allow ce nd C.O. allowance, less income tax deductions.
- 7. Allowances of a temporary na see as Hard Lying Money, Special Victualling allowance when lite in the ledger, Lodging and Prevision Allowance, Colonial A wance and Field Allowance will not be shown in the "daily rate" column or included in the "monthly rate" in pay books, but sums due in respect of them may be drawn in addition to the monthly rate.

- 8. When Hard Lying Money or Field Allowance is payable, the difference between the allowance and C.O. allowance may be paid to the officer concerned in addition to the monthly rate shown in the officer's pay book.

Names of officers requiring alteration slips are to be reported to "Copra" reports in the case of officers abroad to be by signal.
