Nan Commando, HMS Saunders, Exercise Shalufa

Nan RN Beach Commando carried out a number of exercises at <u>HMS Saunders</u>, Kabrit (Kasferit) during November 1943, including Exercise Bangalore 11 on the 7th of November, Exercise Duchess on the 12th of November and Exercise Shallufa on the 25th of November. Nan Commando was being prepared for Operation 'Accolade', the capture of the island of Rhodes. However in December 1943 they were hurriedly added to Operation 'Shingle' the landings at Anzio. These pictures are from Exercise Shallufa.

In the picture below, the front two 'assault troops' with their backs to the camera are Lt Thomas Turton RNVR (Beach Master N3) on the left and Lt Alec Varley RNVR (Assistant Beach Master N2) on the right. They are sat in the Landing Craft Assault (LCA) 'Grey Dawn', note the 'speaker' at the front, part of the loud halo system used by the Beach Masters.
